Her expertise also includes designing and implementing in-house conflict management systems, facilitating large-group processes and writing curricula.

As an educator Cynthia has over 25 years of experience. She has trained thousands of people from around the world in the skills of mediation, facilitation and effective communication.

A charter member of the National Institute of Dispute Resolution, Cynthia has been involved in the Association for Conflict Resolution, the Society of Professionals in Dispute Resolution and the Academy of Family Mediators as a member, volunteer and presenter throughout her career. She is a founding member of the New Mexico Mediation Association.
